INDUSTRY 5.0/SDG IMPLEMENTATION VIA HUMAN TECHNOLOGY

Prof Philip McGOWAN (Phil) is Dean for Engagement and Internationalisation in the faculty of Science, Agriculture and Engineering at Newcastle University (UK), and chairs the university's Sustainable Development Goals Committee. This committee was established to harness the university's diverse work across the 2030 Agenda for Development and that encompasses learning and teaching, research, partnerships for impact and engagement, as well as the university's own operations. He co-chairs the Association of Commonwealth University's 'Higher Education and the SDGs' network.

Prior to joining the university in 2013 Philip worked in international conservation carrying out fieldwork on threatened species and developing capacity building activities, largely in Asia. He now works in science-policy and especially on the conservation status and extinction risk of species, and how best to stem declines and losses, supporting the Convention on Biological Diversity as it develops a new 'global biodiversity framework' from 2020. This work contributes to SDG 15 in particular, but also other targets in other Goals.
